Activities held and their positive results

Reading Hunt Day

Our junior form students were invited by the PTA of La Salle College to join the 'Reading and Knowledge Quiz' in their 'Reading Hunt Day' organized by their Reading Club on 12th March. 20 students, accompanied by teachers, took part in the friendly competition and showed outstanding performance in the reading quiz. They were also interviewed by the Reading Club of La Salle College. Our students found the competition exciting and it was a very rewarding experience for them.



World Book Day

In response to the World Book Day, the 'DEAR' and 'SQUIRT' programmes (Drop Everything And Read and Super Quiet UnInterrupted Reading Time) has been launched in the homeroom period every Friday since 23rd April. The whole school, both teachers and students read quietly on their own and they value their quiet private reading time very much.

In addition, a creative writing competition was organized to encourage students to express their reading in writing and drawing. Prizes were awarded to winners of different writing categories.

Welling to Know the Author

Last year, students put up a board display about Jacqueline Wilson, whose books are very popular with our junior form students. From the display, they could know more about their favourite author. They were also encouraged to share with their schoolmates by sending in their opinions and comments about Jacqueline Wilson and her books.

Book Show

Like the previous years, a book show organized by the PTA was held at the school hall after the final examination. There was a great variety of books on display. They were of different genres and levels to suit different readers. There was also a section displaying religious books. The response from students was excellent.

The Joys of Reading

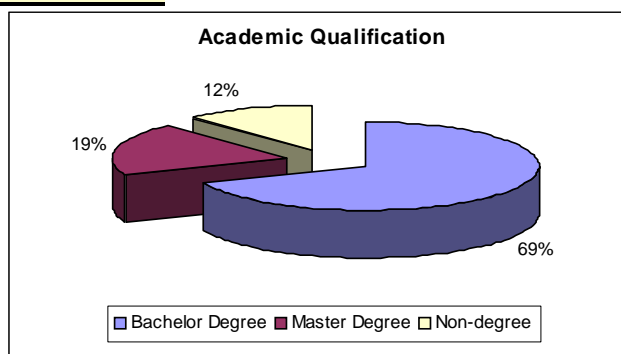
Different students have experienced the joys of reading in one way or another. As reading can be 'contagious', we have tried to organize more reading-related activities for our students on a wider scope. That is, students can share their reading experiences with the class, then with the form, within the school and with other schools as well.

Qualifications

In the academic year 2004-2005, as a 36-class school, we are only entitled to 68 teachers. However we hired 20 extra teacher so as to have small group teaching. Hence $68 + 20 = 88$ teaching staff worked at Good Hope School. On top of the 20 extra teachers, we also had 1 part time teacher and 4 teaching assistants. There were 20 males and 73 females teachers. Therefore, we have 93 teaching staff in total and 13 clerical staff.

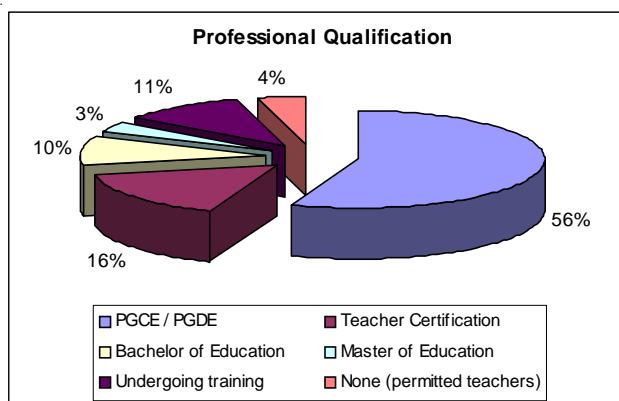
Academic qualification of staff 04-05

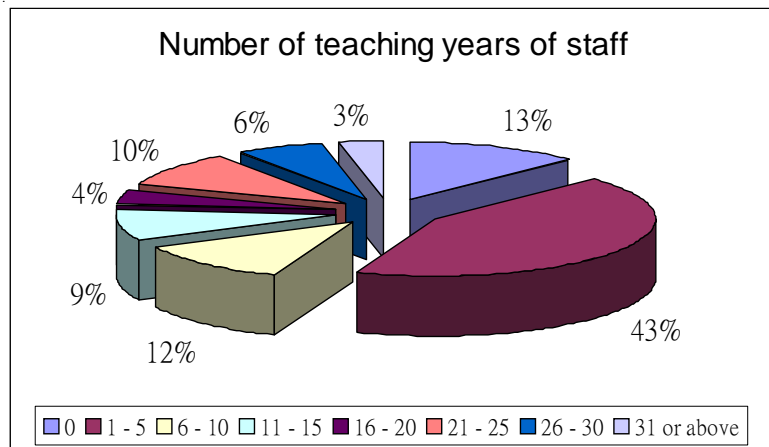

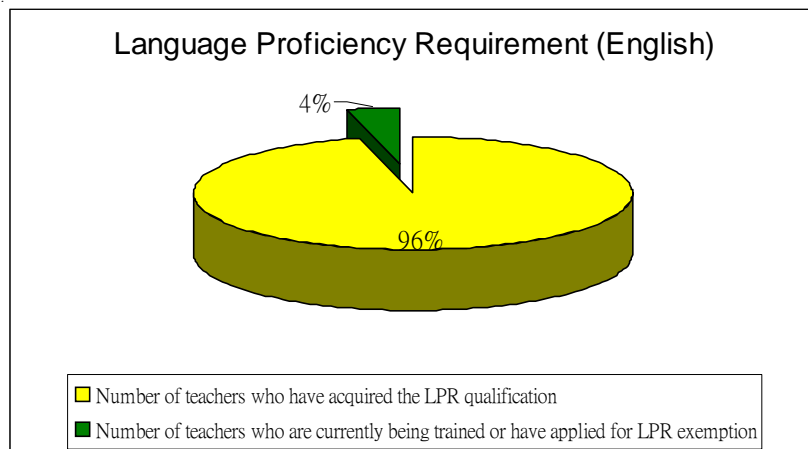

Teaching years of staff 04-05



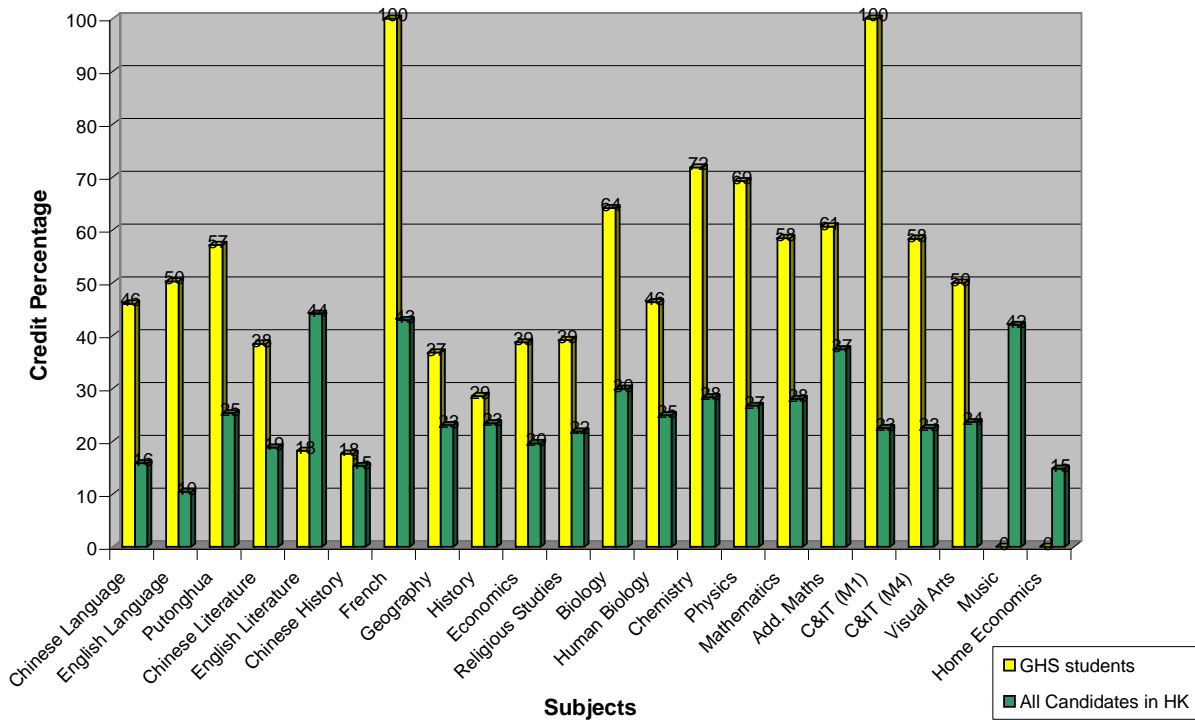

Language Proficiency Requirement

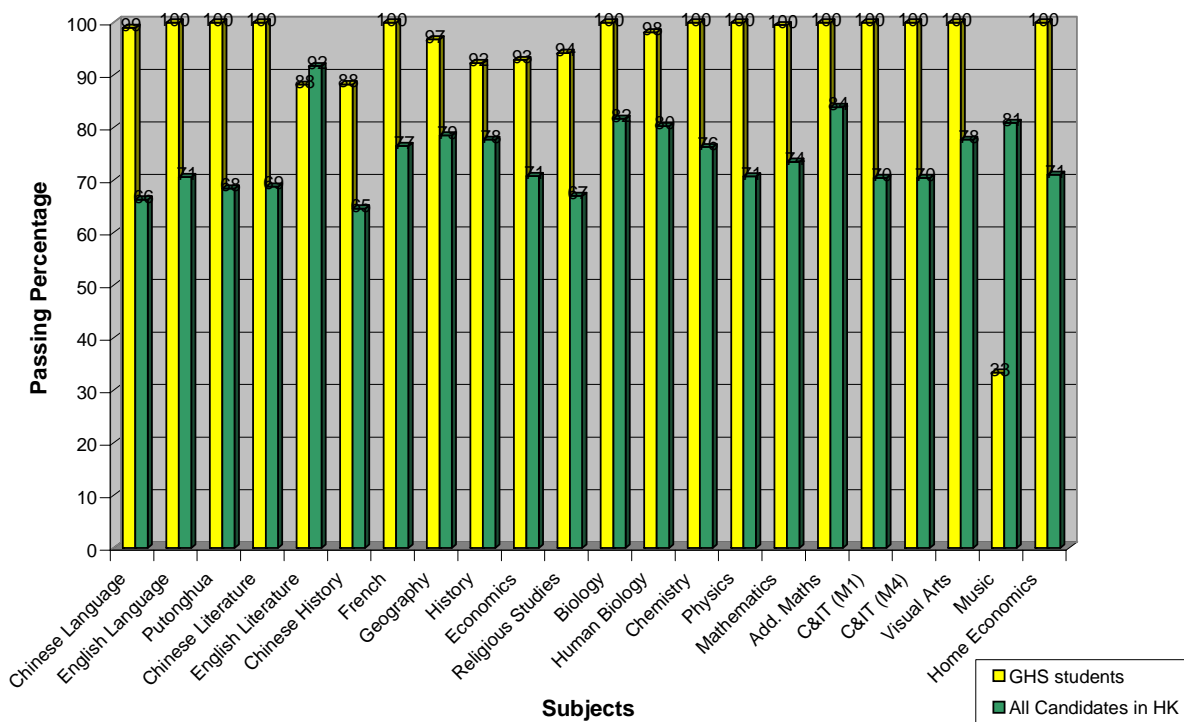


Language Proficiency Requirement (English)

Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination 2005 (Credit Percentage)

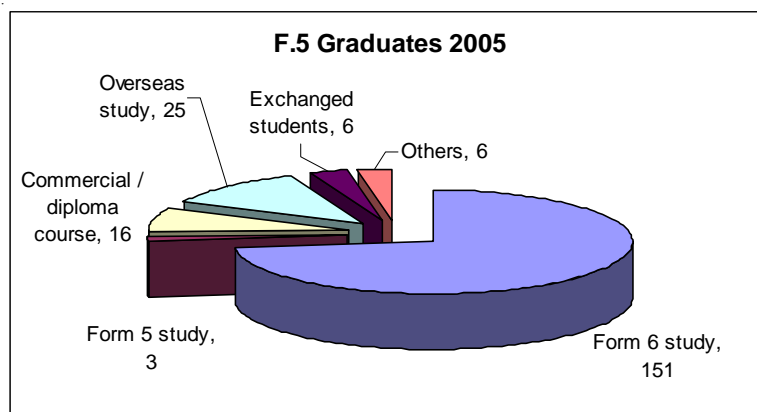


Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination 2005 (Passing Percentage)



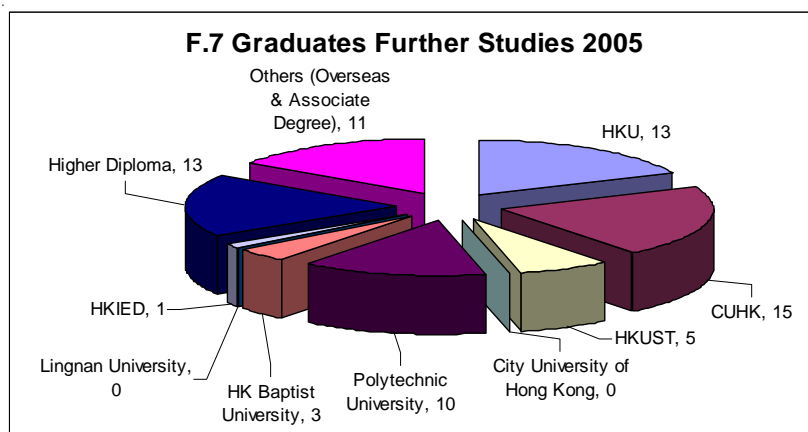

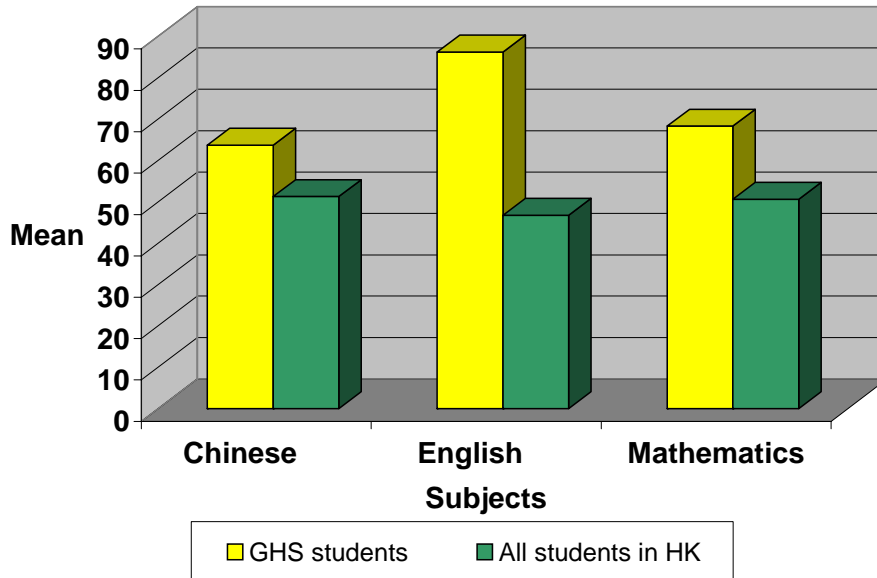

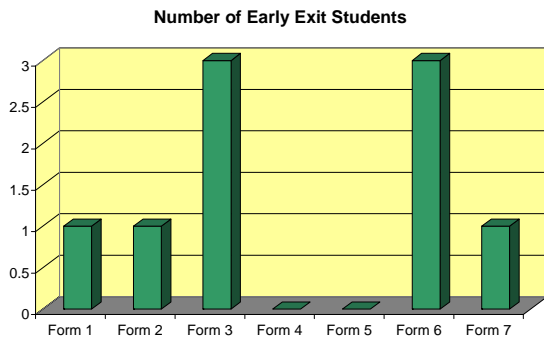

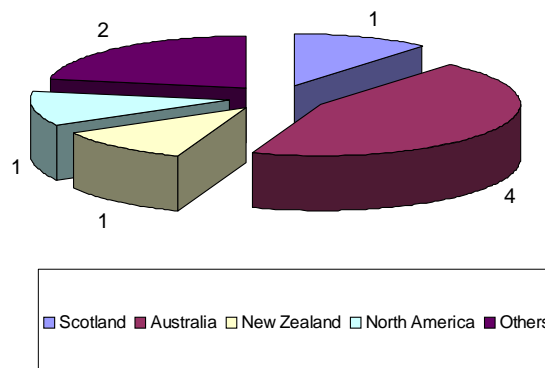
Comparison between the performance of our students and all students in HK



Early Exit Students

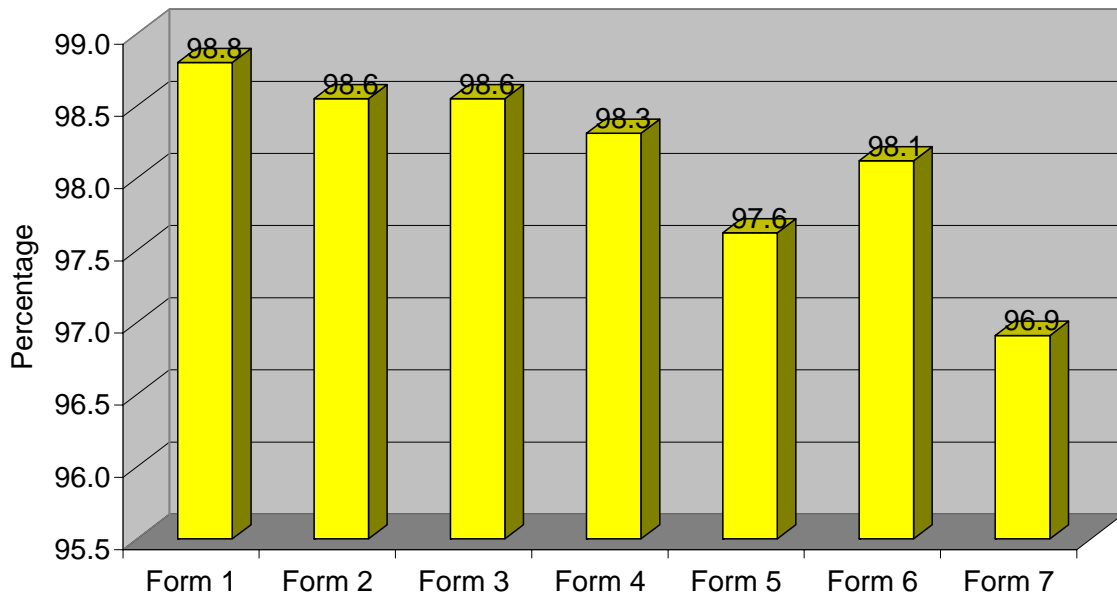


Destination of Early Exit Students
